Short breaks can last just a few hours.



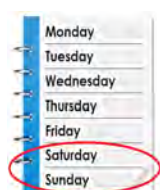
Sometimes they're an evening out.

How to take part



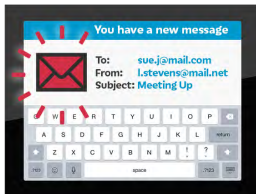
The consultation starts on the 26th October. It finishes on the 6th December.
