Wow! I can't really believe that we're already in the final term of the school year. The children are all learning about Growing in their topic this term and we have lots of other lovely things planned for the rest of the school

### School Pool

School

It has been a turbulent time with our pool over the past few years and a number of you have asked for more information about the pool, together with an update. Challenges we have had with running warm water sessions since April 2020:

- **Covid** there were a high level of health and safety measures needed for • swimming and the risk was too high
- Staff shortages unfortunately, we have a continuing problem with being short staffed which . means we do not always have enough staff to run sessions safely in the pool, priority has to be given to staffing classes
- **Maintenance** We have had a high number of maintenance issues with the pool including, maintaining the correct water temperature, ensuring there is the right chemical level in the water, requiring a new calorex unit which maintains the air temperature and an upgrade to the filtering system. The chair hoist and tracking hoist also needed replacing. This all needed to be commissioned by the local authority
- RAAC We had RAAC in the ceiling of the changing rooms, which needed to be removed and replaced. This all had to be organised through the Local Authority and DfE

I feel it is important to clarify the current purpose of the pool, as I feel this has changed to what has previously been shared in the past. Historically, when the pool was installed in the 1970s, it was designed as a swimming pool. However due to the changing needs of our pupils since the 1990s, its purpose was adjusted and since then it has been run as a hydrotherapy pool.

As a hydrotherapy pool is has a temperature of between 33° and 35°. As such children can only be in the pool for a shorter period of time, a maximum of 30mins. The warm water has a number of different benefits:

- provide relaxation and an opportunity to stretch muscles •
- improve muscle tone and strength
- increase circulation
- improve joint range of movement
- allow freedom of movement due to the difference in weight bearing
- reduce the discomfort associated with having a physical disability. •

While in the past all children were able to have either a regular weekly slot in the pool or access it through a block, this is no longer possible due to our increased number of pupils and our ongoing difficulties with staffing. We have started running warm water sessions for some of our most complex children, and these will become more consistent across this term. If you have been contacted about these sessions, please ensure that your child has their kit in school.

From September, in consultation with physiotherapy and Conductive Education, we are planning for children with complex physical needs to have a weekly slot. We are currently looking at alternative arrangements for the children to have access to water confidence sessions during their time at Fairfields, more information will be provided in the Autumn Term.

While I know some of you have been quite frustrated with the ongoing situation with the pool, I would like to share that I have been equally frustrated and myself and the team have been working hard to try and get things sorted as quickly as we can, however I hope you can understand that many of the difficulties have been out of our control.

### Attendance

As you know, we are updating our school attendance policy this term. This is in line with the new Government Guidance and the School Attendance Support Service at West Northamptonshire Council. It is extremely important that your child attends school regularly and as a school we continually monitor the children's attendance. The



update of the policy will include what happens when a child has an unauthorised absence and how this will be monitored, including when staff will carry out home visits, and the procedure for referring to the Local Authority when a child has a significant amount of time absence from school e.g. for an unauthorised holiday. This year we have seen an increasing amount of unauthorised holiday and requests for absence from school due to extreme circumstances. From September, we will be having a more formal system to request an absence from school and any unauthorised holiday will need to be reviewed against the new government guidance which may result in a fixed penalty notice being issued by the local authority. Once completed, this will be sent out so you are aware of the changes ready for September. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this please get in touch.



### Sensible Footwear

As we move into the summer months, I would like to remind you of the importance of ensuring that your child wears sensible footwear to school. Proper footwear is essential for

your child's safety, comfort, and overall well-being throughout the school day. Sensible shoes help prevent injuries and provide adequate support during physical activities. Please ensure your child wears closed-toe shoes to protect their feet from potential injuries. It important that they have sturdy shoes that fit securely and comfortably.

Please can I ask the your child does not come to school in flip flops or crocs as these shoes can pose safety hazards and are not suitable for school. If you find it difficult for your child to wear certain shoes due to sensory issues, please get in touch.
