



# Fairfields School

## Primary School PE and Sport Grant 2016 – 2017

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport is allocated to primary school head teachers. This funding is ringfenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Fairfields School received £8470 for 2016-2017. The school further supplements the PE provision over and above what other curriculum areas receive.

<b>Warm Water Swim</b> We need to maintain our extended swimming team as our pupils benefit from swimming in our warm water pool.
